## **"To Follow the Teachings and the Footsteps of Our Lord Jesus Christ"**

Christ has finally revealed himself to him in the poorest of the poor of the Middle Ages. From now on Francis will gladly go out to meet him in his Brother Christians. And how it pleased Francis to call those living configurations of the patient Lord by this popular name! The exile from human society to which they saw themselves condemned made them even more pitiable in his eyes.

We can understand now in its historical context the initial statement of his Testament. It was the Lord who "took him among the lepers" to convert him. Having discovered Christ in the poor, he is now prepared to discover him as "brother" in the figure of the crucifix of San Damiano, a vision which is immediately mentioned in all the biographical sources. From that moment he was "completely changed in spirit,"

says Thomas of Celano.

Soon afterwards follows the break with his father, Peter Bernadone, and the dramatic scene before the bishop when the converted one, naked, hands over his clothing and money, that money that he still believed, for the last time, could have been used to do good: "He would have liked to use it to procure food for the poor and restore the hermitage."

Celano describes him inebriated with joy by the new liberty his spirit now enjoyed, proclaiming his happiness in the Provençal language in the nearby woods. He goes to ask for work at an abbey, and there has to experience nakedness and hunger. In Gubbio a friend gives him the necessary clothing. Finally, he "went to the lepers and lived with them, serving them most diligently for God's sake; and washing all foulness from them, he wiped away also the corruption of the ulcers...."

## Warm Weather Food Safety Tips

With Fourth of July picnics, barbecues, and other get-togethers just around the corner, now is a good time to refresh ourselves on some basic food safety tips to protect yourself, family, and friends from food borne illnesses. Just as the temperature and humidity rises, so too are opportunities for food borne bacteria to thrive and multiply. Following some simple food safety guidelines will help ensure that your celebration is safe and free of unexpected (and unwanted) surprises!

- When preparing foods ahead of time such as meats, salads, and poultry, allow plenty of time to chill in the refrigerator.

- Marinate meats and poultry in the refrigerator and don't reuse the marinade.

- Eat any restaurant bought food within 2 hrs. of pick up.

-Store perishable foods in an insulated cooler packed with ice or ice packs. Replenish ice when low and keep cooler in the shade. Cold food should be stored at 40 degrees F or below to prevent bacterial growth.

- Use a food thermometer to check the doneness of meats and poultry: Steaks should be 145 to 170 degrees F; Ground Meat 160 degrees F; Poultry 165-180 degrees F.

- Grilled foods can be kept hot by moving it to the side of the grill rack, just away from the coals.

-Do not use the same dish, utensils, or cutting board for raw and cook foods.

- Food left out for more than 2 hours (1 hour if outdoor temperatures are above 90 degrees F) is not safe to eat and should be discarded. When in doubt, throw it out!
